Uses a variety of questions (e.g. what, where, who).


Beginning to use more complex sentences to link thoughts (and, because).

Enjoys responsibility of carrying out small tasks.


Communication and Language: Speaking


Uses a variety of questions

"Laura found this spoon, but no... Not the spoon!" - Joy






"Yeah, like a **treasure map!"** - Joy









Ali Abbas decided that he wanted to help Joy find the missing spoon too. He made a map as well.

Knows that information can be retrieved from computers.






After the weekend Minara visited our class and asked Joy - "Is this the spoon you are looking for?"

Joy said - "No that is not it! That is small and green and blue, it's not white and blue!"




Joy remembered where the green and blue spoons where from. She remembered seeing them when she was taking her poster around each classroom.

found the missing spoon!!!


