

What we think our children will enjoy learning

The beginning of term is an important time for our children, whether they are returning from their summer holidays or are new to Midland Road Nursery School. Children will be developing their knowledge and skills in so many areas; developing physical skills, social skills and finding out more about the world they live in.

Children will want to explore the environment both indoors and outdoors, and they will be using & playing with resources to find out what they can and can't do! Our aim is to build on this natural curiosity, to support what we know is a natural love of learning for young children.

What we would like to teach our children about

As well as supporting children's natural curiosity we will be supporting children in understanding & adjusting to nursery life, we will help them to manage their feelings and behaviour as they learn to co-operate with each other and look after their environment. This will include supporting turn taking, tidying up, preparing snack, caring about one another, our classroom and their personal belongings!



We will be asking parents to bring in or e-mail us pictures of their family so we can work with the children to create family books, displays and to spark conversation. This will help us talk about different members in our family along with people who are special to us. We will enhance our role play areas to incorporate images of family life and allow the children to re-enact & play out their home life experiences & routines.


We will also be supporting children to develop their independence by following self-care skills, such as undressing, hanging coats on pegs and using the toilet. We will also teach children to put their own coats on using the "Belgium Method" see photos below & ask us or child for a demonstration!

The Belgium Coat Method



We will be teaching children about phonics through story & rhyme sessions. This will support children to develop a knowledge about letters & sounds as well as develop their listening and attention skills. There will be lots of different opportunities for more literacy learning, along with mathematics too!

Our core story for this term will be "Owl Babies" by Martin Waddell. We have chosen this book as it is a timeless classic and offers a safe and secure opportunity to explore separation & anxiety that children naturally experience during times of change.
