What is your **favourite** colour?






Saara used different bits of sticky, shiny foil to make a **collage** on the cover of her book.

Who do you think Won?






We enjoyed working in the creative room because we could work together with our friends and our Mummies and Daddies. Karam Elahi worked with Maja to create patterns.

Sajjad pointed out some birds he found in a glass box. He asked - "Are they real?" Lou explained that they are real but they have been stuffed. We call this Taxidermy.














We looked at books and all the different artists work **inside**.








Lou took us to see the circus exhibition. She told us about when she was in the circus and showed us a picture of her when she was younger hanging upside down
