Extending children's knowledge Following Children's interests

Our planning will adapt and change as we learn more about our children's interests. We will use their interests as starting points to create a learning environment which will excite and challenge them.

Ourselves and Families

Children love to tell us about themselves and their families. We will be learning about ourselves and our families; our bodies, emotions and senses.



We will look at photos of different

families to discuss what makes us unique and special in order to promote a sense of belonging.

Please share photographs of your family and people who are special to your child . We will make books with the children and have conversations about who is important in our lives and why.

Percussion Sounds

The children have shown a growing interest in sounds and how they can made. They have enjoyed exploring how different materials create different noises, using instruments and everyday objects.



We're excited to continue following this interest, introducing new percussion instruments and sound makers through stories at group time. We will provide opportunities for the children to record and listen back to the sounds they create using sound buttons.

We will help the children to count a steady beat and rhythm. We will help them to notice changes in sounds such as "volume"; loud and quiet or "tempo"; slow and fast.

Introducing New Knowledge and Skills This is what we will teach the children

Our **Core Stories** help children to develop their listening skills. Children will become familiar with the books throughout the term and recite repeated phrases.

Core Story in **Blue** and **Green** Room **Owl Babies**

This book will introduce the children to the characters of Sarah, Percy and Bill and explores the theme of separation anxiety that children can naturally experience during times of change and transition.




We will act out the story and begin to teach the children about owls and other nocturnal animals.

Core story in **Purple** and **Orange** Room

Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do you See?

We will use Makaton signs and symbols, songs and rhymes to support our teaching of the sequence of the story, the names of the animals and colours. We will use a wide variety of visual props and sensory resources to support matching and sequencing.



New Routines

As your child settles into nursery we will encourage them to make friends and learn each others names. We will be focussing on your child's wellbeing and independence. We will teach children to put on their own coat and manage their belongings. We will teach children to tidy up after they have finished playing and teach them how to handle the resources with care.

Things you can do to support your child's learning

50 things activities are low cost/ no cost fun activities to do as a family that will support your



child's communication skills and confidence.

We will share one activity each week that you can do at home to support your child's learning.

Aim to read at home with your child every day—Just 5 to 10 minutes is all you need.

Reading with children before they can read themselves is the <u>best</u> way to support your child's learning at home.

All children will be given a book bag to look after their library book. The children will have the chance to visit our school library to choose a book to bring home every Wednesday.
